

School Voucher Program

School vouchers allow families to divert their tax dollars to a school they choose. Last year nearly 35,000 Indiana families were able to access private schools for their children by using a school voucher to help pay tuition.

How to apply for a school voucher:

- 1. Visit www.myschooloptions.org for more information about your eligibility.
- 2. Find a participating private school that best meets your child's needs and enroll.
- 3. Once your child is accepted to the school, you may begin the official school voucher application process with school personnel. All paperwork must be submitted by September 1, 2017.
